## **Graduation Requirements**

#### **School of Management**

#### **Bachelor of Science in Management**

- 128 credits
- Management Core requirements
- Major requirements
- Minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA
- Complete a minimum of 44 University Core credits
- Complete a minimum of 44 Upper Division credits in your major

Professional Bachelor's Degree Program students typically register for 2 classes in the Fall, Spring, <u>and</u> Summer semesters.

**Rhetoric & Composition** 

All students need to complete Rhetoric and Composition. In order to complete this Core A2 requirement, you are required to take INTD 310, which is built into the curriculum of your major.

#### INTD 310 Interdisciplinary Research and Writing

This class fulfills part of your University Core requirements. INTD 310 fulfills Core area A2, Rhetoric & Composition and the Cultural Diversity requirement.

This writing course will help you develop and write experiential essays for your Interdisciplinary Studies Assessment (ISA). These essays may provide you with the opportunity to earn up to 21 credits that may be applied to

certain University Core areas or as General Elective credits. Additional information about the ISA writing process will be provided during Orientation and during your INTD 310 writing course.

You must successfully complete INTD 310 with a grade of "C-" or higher. Those students who do not achieve this minimum requirement will be required to repeat the course and may be placed on academic probation.

#### **Tips for Browsing the Class Schedule**

- ⇒ While browsing the schedule of classes, it is helpful to jot down the CRN (Course Registration Number).
- ⇒ Clicking on the CRN of the course allows you to see how many seats are remaining and if there is a prerequisite for the class.
- ⇒ To find a description of the course, click
   "View Catalog Entry".
- ⇒ When searching for classes, the abbreviation "TR" = Tuesdays and Thursdays; "R" = Thursdays.
- ⇒ Courses that begin numerically with 3xx and 4xx are upper division courses.
- ⇒ To email the professor, click the envelope icon.





A hold is placed on your myUSF account if you do not conform to University policies and procedures. Holds can prevent you from registering for classes and from changing your class schedule. A common hold that will appear on your myUSF account is the "Student Agreement of Financial Responsibilities" hold. Once you agree to the terms and conditions, and click to acknowledge your responsibility to pay for tuition and fees, the hold will be removed.

Another hold that is common is a financial hold. If you have any type of financial hold, you must contact the One Stop Enrollment and Financial Services Office (<u>onestop@usfca.edu</u>) to reconcile your student account and have the hold removed.

# Rules & Regulations

# Dropping Classes

The last day to drop a class and receive a tuition refund is listed on the USF Academic Calendar as *Last Day to Drop Courses with a Refund*. Students who absent themselves from class, or just stop going, or tell their instructor they are dropping the course without filling the required drop form or dropping online will receive an "F" for the course. Make sure you're using the proper procedures for dropping a class.

# Credit Hour Limitations

Full-time students take 12 credits per semester; part-time students take fewer than 12 credits. Be careful if you change your credit hour load because it may affect your educational grants and loans.

# Class Attendance & Incomplete Grades

USF expects students to attend all classroom and lab exercises. Any absences may affect final grades. Be sure to read the course syllabi carefully to understand all of your instructor's expectations. If, for some reason, you are given an "I", or an incomplete grade, you must make sure to complete all of the work for the course in a timely manner; otherwise the incomplete grade converts to an "F" by the close of the following semester.

# Academic Probation

If you drop below a 2.0 GPA overall, you'll be placed on academic probation.

# Dean's Honor Roll

- 8. Abuse of Shared Electronic Media—Damage or sabotage of campus computer systems
