*There is a numerical discrepancy between the amount of data collected for LO 3a and the rest of the LO assessed via our Methods course. I am looking into finding out what happened here.

Overall, we seem to be achieving our learning outcomes with 67% of our students in the good or very good category and about 88% scoring at average or above. However, we need to examine more closely what is happening with Learning Outcomes 2a, 3a, and 3d. In addition, if we take a closer

look at Learning Outcome 3, and its various components, we can see that there is a discrepancy between what is considered satisfactory in Methods and what students are expected to be able to do in our Capstone and Thesis classes. As of now, we have yet to close the loop and have a departmental discussion of this matter.
