


Figure 1: Asian American 6-year Graduation Rate (N = 875)

Note. The marked lines indicate the values for USF (80%) and the average Asian American rate (60%). USF is ranked 267^{th} and is tied with 19 other institutions.




Figure 2: African American 6-year Graduation Rate (N = 1,054)

Note: The marked lines indicate the values for USF (59%) and the average African American rate (43%). USF is ranked 266^{th} and is tied with nine other institutions.




Figure 3: Latino Six-Year Graduation Rate (N = 1,067)

Note: The marked lines indicate the values for USF (69%) and the average Latino/a rate (50%). USF is ranked 261^{th} and is tied with 12 other institutions.





Figure 4: White Six-Year Graduation Rate (N = 1,206)
