Mentored Research Scientist Development Award (Parent K01)	<p>The overall objective is to prepare qualified individuals for careers that have a significant impact on the health-related research needs of the Nation and to provide support for a sustained period of “protected time” for intensive research career development under the guidance of an experienced mentor, or sponsor, in the biomedical, behavioral or clinical sciences leading to research independence. The expectation is that through this sustained period of research career development and training, awardees will launch independent research careers and become competitive for new research project grant (R01) funding. The size and duration of each award will vary from application to application.</p>	<p>Feb 12, Jun 12, Oct 12, every year</p>
New and Early Stage Investigator Policies, NIH	<p>"New Investigators" are defined as a PI who has not competed successfully for a substantial NIH independent research award. In order to address both the duration of training and to protect the influx of new investigators, the NIH identified Early Stage Investigators. ESIs are New Investigators who are within 10 years of completing their terminal research degree or within 10 years of completing their medical residency at the time they apply for R01 grants. Changes in Health Care Financing and Organization, Robert Wood Johnson Foundation	<p>The program supports research, policy analysis and evaluation projects that provide policy leaders timely information on health care policy, financing and organization issues. Projects may be initiated from within many disciplines, including health services research, economics, sociology, political science, public policy, public health, public administration, law and business administration. The foundation authorized this initiative for \$5 million over approximately three years. Grants are awarded for small projects: less than \$100,000 up to 12 months; or for projects requiring more than \$100,000 and/or projected to take longer than 12 months.</p>	<p>Rolling basis</p>
