Program and Language Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum overall GPA of 3.0 (School of Management students must also maintain a 2.75 GPA for their major) • Good academic and disciplinary standing • Students must enroll in a 16 units (U.S. credit hours) per semester <p>* Consult academic dean for below minimum GPA approvals and major-specific requirements. Check with study abroad advisor or program website for country and program specific requirements.</p>
Language of Instruction	Courses are taught in English.
Application Deadline Fall & Spring: Dec. 1st	<p>Applying to study abroad for a semester is a two-step process. <i>You should plan to apply at the beginning of the Fall semester of your Sophomore year.</i></p> <p>1. Students must meet with a Study Abroad Advisor and complete a USF Study Abroad Pre-application for their program of choice and an alternate through the Center for Global Education's website. Pre-Applications completed by the Dec 1st deadline will be reviewed and students will be notified of their program nomination by the 3rd week of January.</p> <p>2. Accepted students can then apply for their nominated program. Students are responsible for submitting the host program's application and required documentation by the program's deadline. <i>Please note that nomination by USF does not guarantee acceptance by the host program.</i></p>
Program Dates	Fall: Mid-August to late November (This program is only offered in the Fall.)
Course Subjects	<p>Courses offered include The Scandinavian Welfare State in an Age of Globalization (equivalent of two courses), Scandinavian Art, Film and Literature, Norwegian Language or Independent Study</p> <p>*Courses subject to change</p>
Special Courses, Internships, and/or Scholarships	<p>Students will intern 4-6 hours each week with a local organization.</p> <p>HECUA offers scholarships for semester and academic year programs.</p> <p>See website for more information: https://www.hecua.org/programs/scholarships</p>
Accommodation	<p>In Norway, students live in a student village near campus and have a 4-day homestay. In Denmark and Sweden, students stay in youth hostels or similar accommodations.</p> <p>The program fee covers group transportation to field sites, planned group excursions (Stockholm or Copenhagen), lodging, meals, local transportation, medical insurance, and administrative costs.</p> <p>*USF Program Fee: Includes room and board.</p>
Other Expenses Not Included in USF Tuition	<p>Airfare, passport, visa, books, transportation, independent travel, incidentals, extra meals and housing deposit. (Students are required to pay a housing deposit for possible damage to the apartment. The deposit will be returned after checking for damage at the end of the program.)</p> <p>*Print the Budget Planning Worksheet to determine cost estimates</p>
Supplemental Health and Travel Assist Services	Enrollment in USF sponsored programs include automatic coverage through ACE/AXA Assistance USA, Inc. while abroad.
Visa Requirements	You will need a student visa to enter and study in Norway. You must apply as soon as possible once accepted. Documents must be submitted in person or by a duly authorized

third party. Contact consulate for specific documents, requirements, and instructions.
