72.1% of all degree seeking undergraduates were awarded some type financial aid and 24.7% were awarded Pell Grants. Average amount of all aid awarded was \$36,152. 25.8% of full-time, first-time freshman students were awarded Pell Grants and 82.3% were awarded institutional grants averaging \$24,117 and 82.9% were awarded some type financial aid.
