We will continue the multi-year assessment plan submitted from our that will get us through all of the PLOs in the next 5 years. We have previously gone through a process of norming the PLO Rubric 1 by taking final papers from APAS classes to test the rubrics. The same process will be used for PLO 2 and 3 with adjustments made if necessary after each session and before they are used to assess the Capstone projects.

Capstone projects will be assessed by a committee of no less than 3 faculty who teach APAS classes and are trained on the rubric. We will then bring all the findings back to the APAS faculty committee to 'close the loop' and decide what actions should be taken based on the findings.

2021-2022

With Evelyn Ho on sabbatical and Genevieve Leung coming back from a leave of absence, APAS transitioned to David Kim and Genevieve as co-directors. We will continue with the multi-year plan that Evelyn Ho and Byron Au Yong developed:

2022-2023:

- Assess the 7 Capstone projects for PLO1 (collected from 2018-2021)
- We will also be revisiting some of the equity work done last year as we reflect on the one-year anniversaries of some of these tragedies and what that means for APAS equity work on campus.

- Create and test rubric for PLO3
- Close the loop on PLO1 based on Capstone assessment
