APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 is required to apply. Once accepted into the program, a 2.5 cumulative **and** semester GPA are required to continue membership. If you have concerns about your GPA, please contact Professor Vu or the Moot Court Board.
- 2. Applications are **due no later than 11:59 p.m. on Monday, April 14, 2025**. Interviews will take place in the week after the Applications are due.
- 3. Completed Applications must contain the documents listed below and in the order set out below. Failure to follow formatting instructions will impact your application.
 - a. A complete Application form;
 - b. Signed and dated acknowledgment of page 5 of this Application;
 - c. Responses to questions 1-7 (see below);
 - d. A current resume;
 - e. A copy or screenshot of your transcript from "MyUSF"; and
 - f. A legal writing sample (10-15 pages maximum) indicating the semester it was written.
- 4. Please submit an electronic copy of your application.
 - a. Applications should be emailed to the Moot Court Board at usfmootcourt@gmail.com
 - b. The electronic copy and ALL attachments must be merged into one PDF document.
 - c. Please note failure to submit a completed app that complies with formatting instructions may result in your application not being considered.
- 5. After submitting your application, the Moot Court Board will send you a sign-up sheet for an interview time. Interviews will take place in-person.
 - a. ALL APPLICANTS will be required to and should be prepared to deliver a 1.5 minute 2 minute oral argument during their interview. The Board will likely ask questions during this time. We suggest using your introduction and road

map from First Year Moot Court. We do NOT want to hear a recitation of the facts.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FROM THE INFORMATION PACKET

- 1. Case Counsel receive one (1) unit per semester.
- 2. Competition Team Members receive two (2) units during the semester in which they compete and are required to enroll in the three (3) unit Appellate Advocacy class in the Fall. New members selected to compete on Saul Lefkowitz Moot Court Competition are required to enroll in the one (1) unit Lefkowitz Workshop in the fall semester, three (3) unit Appellate Advocacy course and the one (1) unit Advanced Moot Court Program in the Fall semester. In the Spring, Lefkowitz competitors will receive one (1) unit for competition.
- 3. All Case Counsel and Spring Competition Team Members are required to enroll in the one (1) unit Advanced Moot Court Program.
