



What changes to curriculum or program did you make (or are you planning to make) in light of the results?

This is an example of curricular changes made based on the results of a BSN direct measure. After administering the Hesi exam, there were (4) concept areas that were low performing. The BSN faculty identified which courses the contents were taught so that additional reinforcement and improvement can be made to the respective course and weekly learning outcomes.

Hilltop Hesi Nursing Concepts below 850 score threshold:

4 concept areas were below the 850 score threshold with the three most recent cohorts.
