This beautiful garden features many decorative flowers such as the vibrant yellow and pink roses. However, there are some veggies like artichokes and strawberries as well.

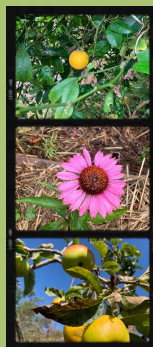


SUSTAINABLE GARDENING

ENVA 233: Urban Agriculture (S)

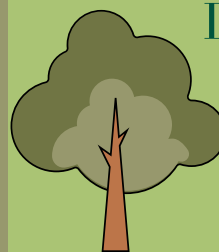
