BRIGHTLINE DEFENSE PROJECT

Brightline is an EJ non-profit that promotes sustainability and opportunity. They work to empower communities, advance environmental justice, and create sustainable environments for underserved people.

GREENACTION

Based in SF, Greenaction is a multiracial, grassroots organization that fights for health and environmental justice with low-income, working class, urban, rural, and BIPOC communities by mobilizing communities and taking direct action to build a healthy world for the environment and future generations.

MOVEMENT GENERATION

MG is working to secure a Just Transition led by communities on the frontlines of ecological disruption. They work through vehicles of movement building, political education, and cultural strategy.

LAVENDER PHOENIX

The goal of Lavender Phoenix's Ecological Justice League is to bring together and inspire queer and trans API people in the SF Bay in order to take action to stop environmental injustices especially as they affect BIPOC.

HUMMINGBIRD FARM

The Hummingbird Farm transformed underutilized lands in SF into a community farm that supports the health and wellness of residents and teaches water conservation and sustainable food practices. The garden provides hundreds of pounds of produce and a community space.

WOMEN'S ENVIRONMENTAL NETWORK

WEN enhances stewardship of the environment through the development and empowerment of women working to protect and nourish reciprocal relationships with the environment.

BROWN GIRL SURF

Brown Girl Surf works to build a more diverse, environmentally reverent, and joyful women's* and girl's*, and gender expansive surf culture by increasing access to surfing, cultivating community, amplifying the voices of surfers of color, and taking care of the Earth.

LATINO OUTDOORS

Latino Outdoors inspires, connects and engages Latinos in the outdoors and embraces *cultura y familia* as apart of the outdoor narrative. LO is actively growing a community of Latino outdoor users, mentors, and stewards, by offering free outdoor activities and supporting people in their introduction to nature.

BLACK GIRLS HIKE

Black Girls Hike highlights and presents black women and POC in nature through outdoor adventures. While diversifying outdoors and reconnecting BIPOC with the all that nature has to offer, they aim to create an inclusive community of outdoor enthusiasts that shares their love of travel, nature, and the outdoors.

SOGOREA TE' LAND TRUST

Sogorea Te' is an urban, Indigenous, women-led trust that, through rematriation, cultural revitalization, and land restoration, is healing and transforming the legacies of colonization, genocide, and patriarchy.

DEEP MEDICINE CIRCLE

DMC is a WOC-led collaborative that is dedicated to repairing critical relationships that have been fractured due to colonialism through food, medicine, story, restoration, and learning. They are actively reimagining the food system through Native farming.

THE CULTURAL CONSERVANCY

Specializing in Native foodways, art, and communication, the TCC works to protect and restore Indigenous culture and empowers them in the direct application of traditional knowledge and practices.

ASIAN PACIFIC ENVIRONMENTAL NETWORK

APEN has deep roots in California's Asian immigrant and refugee communities. They are leading a transition away from an extractive economy and toward local, healthy, and life-sustaining economies that benefit everyone.

PODER SF

PODER's mission is to organize with Latinx immigrant families, black, Indigenous and other low-income communities of color, and youth to cultivate community-rooted solutions to put into practice people-powered solutions that are locally based, community led and environmentally just.
