


Zoom Guide for Students at USF


This brief guide covers the university Zoom account that is available to all students. We will cover the accounts page and the importance of signing in and keeping your app updated.

The USF Zoom Account page

You can access your USF Zoom account on the <https://usfca.zoom.us> site; click the link **Sign In** and login with your USF username and password.



Also on the main page is the link **Download Zoom** to access the page to download the installer for **Zoom Client for Meetings**.





Signing into the Zoom Client with Single Sign On (SSO)

It is important to sign through Single Sign On (SSO) into the Zoom client on your PC, Mac and mobile device to be able to access the features of the USF licensed account. This is available to all faculty staff and students. This document goes through the steps of signing in through SSO. First launch the app on your Mac, PC or mobile device.




Zoom App on a Mac




Zoom App on a PC


Once you launch the app, click **Sign In** to continue.



Click on **Sign In with SSO** and enter **usfca** into the field under **Sign In with SSO** and click **Continue**.




You will be redirected to the USF login page to login with your USF username and password to sign in to Zoom.



After you sign in, the Zoom app will show the tools for scheduling, starting and joining a meeting.



You can check to see if you have signed in with the university account by clicking on the small icon in the upper right side of the application that has your picture or initials. You should see your name, USF email address and the licensing status should say **Licensed or Pro**. If it says Basic, sign out and follow the steps for signing in with SSO.



Updating your Zoom client

It is important to keep the Zoom client updated to make sure you have the latest features as well as the latest security updates. You can check for updates for the client on your PC or Mac by clicking on the small icon in the upper right side of the application that has your picture or initials. In the menu, click on Check for Updates to see if there are any available updates. Don't ignore the updates!
