

Exam Fund Resolution

Resolution: 20-21-15

Whereas: the core Jesuit values of USF reinforce the idea that learning is a humanizing and social activity, not a competitive exercise¹; and

Whereas: the University has a student body that pursues a wide range of professions in a wide variety of fields including but not limited to law, medicine, management, pharmacy, and education that require a variety of graduate programs in which entry exams are necessary. These exams are necessary in the process of furthering the students education past undergrad and professional goals; and

Whereas: the cost of graduate admission exams necessary to further the education and learning of USF students can be upwards of \$450 on top of study materials needed i.e., LSAT, MCAT, and GRE; and

Whereas: the COVID-19 pandemic has heightened the financial burdens and stressors of being a student and continuing an education beyond the undergraduate level; and

Whereas: the University currently provides no support for graduate admission exams, yet our sister university, Gonzaga University, offers an Undergraduate Professional Grant which supports undergraduate students who demonstrate need for financial assistance for professional developmental activities, including, but not limited to, paying for professional attire, attending a conference, and paying for graduate school admissions testing².

Resolved by the Associated Students of the University of San Francisco Senate in its role as the sole representative body of all the undergraduates students of the University of San Francisco, that the following be enacted:

Resolved: that up to \$10,000 from the ASUSF Student Activity Reserves be allocated to an official Exam Fund for the academic year of 2021-2022 to support undergraduate students when

paying for exams necessary to further their education past undergraduate school (see supporting information at the end of the document); furthermore, be it

Resolved: that third and fourth year students will be prioritized in the application process; furthermore, be it

Resolved: that being a current student and paying the Activity Fee be the only requirements to apply for a one-time grant for a maximum of \$250 from the Exam Fund; furthermore, be it

Resolved: that this fund will be managed by the Vice President of Finance in coordination with the Assistant Director of Student Government; furthermore, be it

Resolved: that the fund will be evaluated at the end of the spring semester in order to gauge the demand of the fund and evaluate how to proceed with upkeep of the fund for upcoming years
