- 4) CBE Plan for BSBA program
 - a. In spring '22 we will administer pre and post exams to all students in the Capstone classes (401,403,406). The difference from the last time we did this is that Prof. Monika Hudson received a grant and worked with the Library to build a courselet with supplemental materials to assist students in domain areas they might need to review.
 - b. We will also compare one section that will receive augmented coaching with other sections to see if there is a difference in scores.

 - MSFA Program Director John Gonzales shared that MSFA is on track to complete streamlining and revision from Program Goals and Learning Outcomes to Learning Competencies by February '22.
 - b. AD Richard Stackman added that all Grad programs are on track to move to new Learning Competencies in spring '22.
