Dear USF Community,

Over the past two weeks, there has been an increase in vehicle break-ins and thefts from vehicles parked in USF parking lots and on the streets surrounding campus. Although in some of these incidents no property was taken from the vehicles, most of the thefts resulted in opportunists taking advantage of valuables left in the vehicles.

In light of the upcoming commencement ceremonies and many families visiting campus from out of town, the Department of Public Safety would like to remind the USF community of the following parking safety tips:

- Roll up windows and lock your vehicle.
- Do not leave any valuables in sight.
- Put valuables and packages in the trunk or out of sight before arriving at your destination.

### Review of Crime Bulletin Messaging and Public Safety Practices

On May 4, representatives from the Black Community Council (BCC) and the Cultural Centers, as well as the vice provost for Diversity Engagement and Community Outreach, the vice provost of Student Life, the dean of students, and the director of Public Safety met to discuss the use of race as a descriptor in campus crime bulletins. This was in reference to a crime bulletin that was distributed to the campus community on April 29, 2017. The discussion led to an agreement that there was a need to review the policy of using race and gender in crime bulletins and whether our current crime bulletin messaging is consistent with the mission, vision, and values of the University of San Francisco.

BCC members and others who participated in the May 4, 2017 discussion, as well as student representatives, will hold a follow-up meeting within the next month to review proposed policy changes, and to discuss the creation of a Community Policing Advisory Board for the Department of Public Safety. After our next meeting, we will provide updates regarding our progress amending current practices.

Dear USF Community,

Earlier this evening, at 8:30 p.m., the Department of Public Safety received information that a USF student was the victim of a robbery on Cole St. near Grove St. The suspect grabbed the student, pointed a firearm at her and demanded she hand over her purse and cellphone. The student complied with the suspect, who then ordered the student to run in the other direction. The student ran back to campus and called Public Safety. There were no physical injuries.

Earlier this afternoon at 4:23 p.m., the Department of Public Safety received information that a student was the victim of a robbery on Wednesday, September 13, at 9:00 p.m. The USF student was sitting in his car on Golden Gate Ave. near Central Ave. The suspect approached his vehicle and opened the driver side door. The suspect pointed a gun at him and demanded his wallet and phone. The student gave the suspect his phone and his credit cards. The suspect then fled the area, and the student contacted the San Francisco Police Department. There were no physical injuries.

The San Francisco Police Department and the USF Department of Public Safety are investigating. USF officers are conducting extra patrols in the area.
