- ISSS: Are there plans for staff expansion since, in recent years, there has been a backlog?
 - a. Look into inviting Marcella DeProto, Director of International Student Scholar Services.
 - b. Some of the issues last year were due to government and country-specific situations.

2. Student Financial Services?

- a. At USF, they look at organizationally what makes the most sense. Currently, the financial plan that USF has best supports the financial aid packages that USF offers.
- 3. Is enrollment for the AY2023-2024 low?
 - a. As a tuition-driven institution, 99% of how USF pays the bills is from tuition.



- b. USF has been working on their EKG to make our enrollment more of a "flat line" or more consistent.
- c. This year, UCs went to their waitlist, and many students who may have committed to USF left for a UC.
 Additionally, there has been data to show that students are leaving California.
- d. Furthermore, USF predicted an enrollment cliff & cost is one of the number one factors for students leaving higher education.
- 4. Is USF considering diversifying its streams of income?
 - a. The main goal of USF is to diversify revenue and acknowledge the pressure of running the institution due to the high cost of living. Currently still integrating (enrollment and retention, diversifying income, utilizing campus during summer, branding, community building, diversity equity, and inclusion).
- 5. Response to San Francisco being a dangerous city:
 - a. Compared to other cities, San Francisco is one of the safer cities.
 - Additionally, USF is situated in one of the safest neighborhoods in SF. It is essential to have conversations with people who have questions about the safety of USF.
- 6. How can students help with retention/how can specific organizations get more funding from the school?
 - Reach out to Lindsey McClenahan, Vice President of Development.



- b. Donors often connect with USF for specific projects, which attracts other donors. However, USF does reach out and communicate, for example, that they are fundraising for scholarship money and are looking for x amount of money for students.
- 7. Is there a housing scholarship bucket?
 - a. Student Life Emergency Account: USF can only give out \$600 to students in terms of support; if it exceeds that, it must be taxed. If it DOES go beyond \$600, it starts affecting their financial aid package and housing.
 - b. When USF does fundraise, its main focus is academics.
 - i. Follow-up: Are there ways that specific endowments can go to housing?
 - Yes, at certain times, the University can allocate money from a donor or endowment and direct it towards buckets or areas that they feel need development.
- 8. How can Senate ensure that they are making a concerted effort to make sure that money is going to areas that need more funding?
 - a. During donor events, USF promotes student needs. Ie.
 Housing, mental health, and city costs in hopes that donors decide to donate to specific causes.
 - i. Follow-up: Would ASUSF be able to attend the donor event?
 - Julie Orio will ask and follow up with Senate.

- a. USF usually works with the family in long-term cases and communicates via mediators. I.e. a settlement.
- b. When there is a short-term issue in terms of a hospital bill, the first place of contact would be the Dean of Students.
 - i. Follow-up: How can students communicate with RA's about mold issues and compensation for possible mold harm?
 - Contact Aja Holmes, Assistant Dean of Students and Director of Community Living.
