Criteria: Students will be selected for a one-year scholarship based on the following:

- **A.** Completion of one year of J.D. study at USF School of Law by the end of Spring 2023, and enrollment at the School of Law during 2023-24. Note: Dual degree students must apply during the Spring of JD enrollment year; award will be deferred if enrollment in the subsequent year is primarily in a non-law program.
- B. Demonstrated academic potential, i.e. the student is in good standing upon conclusion of Spring 2023.
- **C.** Enrolled as a full-time law student at USF during 2023-24.
- D. Confirmed financial need for 2023-24 by the law school's financial aid process. See Instruction #4 below.
- **E.** Demonstrated detail of individual, active involvement in extra-curricular activities during 2022-23 which contributed to law school life. See Instructions.

Please Note:

- Preferential consideration may be given to applicants who will not receive other significant USF funding for the 2023-24 academic year.
- Recipients of University funding, (i.e., scholarships, grants, stipends, tuition remission, etc.) will not be granted institutional funding in excess of tuition.
- Previous Zief scholarship recipients may apply, but receipt of a prior award will be considered during the selection process.

Awards: Multiple awards, up to 50 (fifty), of between \$2,500 - \$10,000 each will be granted to students with financial need selected for their significant contribution(s) to the School of Law for non-curricular activities

- -Divided between two groups of students: a) 2FT, 2PT, 3PT and b) 3FT, 4FT, 4PT.
- -Award is applied in equal amounts (one-half) to Fall and Spring tuition charges.
- -Recipients must be enrolled in law school classes to receive an award for the semester.

Instructions: Along with this completed form, applicants must submit the following:

- 1. A statement of two pages or less (double-spaced), specifying your 2022-23 extra-curricular contributions to School of Law.
 - The statement will be reviewed for the substance of each applicant's activities as well as for its organization, clarity, and grammar.
 - The statement should focus on your 2022-23 law school activities.
 - Activities must be identified as individual or collaborative efforts.
 - Must provide specific details of *your* involvement. The quality of your involvement in an activity will be given greater consideration than the quantity of activities.
 - The emphasis for this scholarship is on non-credit, non-paid, non-curricular activities.
- 2. Current Resume, highlighting your non-paid, non-credit contributions to USF School of Law.
- 3. Denote your contributions on your resume with three asterisks (***).
- **4.** Submit your <u>official FAFSA form for 2023-24</u> to the Federal Processor by the scholarship deadline. <u>Please Note</u>: If you are ineligible for FAFSA, the School of Law Financial Aid Office will provide an alternative means of satisfying the financial need requirement.
