



International Travel Considerations and Reminders

WEEKLY UPDATE – May 10

As you prepare for summer break, we are writing to make sure you have the most

current travel information and feel confident in what you need for departing and re-

entering the U.S. If you are already outside of the U.S. or decide to travel home this summer, please read the information below for guidance on what to expect and what documents you need. We recommend that you continue to review the ISSS COVID-19 FAQ as well as the USF Together web page for the most up-to-date information on these topics. TRAVEL CONSIDERATIONS When planning for your return to the U.S. you will want to consider flight, travel, and

entry restrictions. In order to support students as you make your plans for travel and

arrival to the US, USF has established a Global Response Team. If you have questions

about travel logistics, the Global Response Team can support you. Please contact our team at travel@usfca.edu. **U.S. Entry Restrictions:** The US Department of State has announced that students on an F1 or J1 visa will be exempt from the **entry restrictions** when arriving for the fall semester. This means that our international students DO NOT need to guarantine in a third country for 14 days and can fly directly to the US when arriving within 30 days of

the fall semester. Prior to entry for the fall semester, the entry restrictions will apply.

Students traveling in the F1 visa category will automatically receive the National **Interest Exemption** when entering up to 30 days before the start of the fall semester. Students traveling in the J1 visa category will need to apply for the National Interest **Exemption** at your local US consulate when entering up to 30 days before the start of the fall semester. Guidance for Air Travelers: Per the CDC announcement, beginning Jan. 26, 2021, air travelers who plan to enter the U.S. need to provide a negative COVID-19 test to their airline in order to board their flight. If a passenger does not provide documentation

of a negative test or recovery, the airline must deny boarding to the passenger. Additionally, upon arrival in the U.S., **state** and **local** public health authorities now require all travelers (international and domestic) returning to the Bay Area to **quarantine**. Please read the regulations linked above for additional information. DOCUMENTS NEEDED FOR TRAVEL Get a Travel Signature by Submitting a Request for an I-20 Reprint: You can obtain a travel signature from ISSS by submitting a request for an "I-20 Reprint" or "DS-2019

receive an email notification when your electronic I-20 has been issued and uploaded onto your MyISSS account. **Required Documents for Travel:** All international students leaving the U.S. need to be in possession of the following upon reentry: Valid I-20/DS-2019 with a current travel signature from within the last year

(Travel signatures should be valid within six months for students on OPT).

Additional items to carry with you and present if requested:

Custom and Border Protection (CBP) Search Procedures: When you arrive in the U.S. from any international destination, you may encounter stricter inspection procedures. CBP is legally allowed to search any item you are bringing into the U.S. This includes turning on and asking you to log in to your email, social media, and other

Renewing your U.S. Student Visa: If your student visa (or visa you are studying on) will expire before you plan to return to the U.S., you need to renew it. The visa renewal application is much like the initial visa application and in almost all cases will require

you to apply in person and sit for an interview. Please check for visa processing times and book your appointment early. Other information about the visa application process

can be found on the ISSS website and on the U.S. State Department website.
