Your USF Education and Beyond, Career Planning

Are you pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree and trying to figure out the best next step on your journey? As you navigate your career and academic opportunities as an international student, we have prepared some relevant resources, including information about F-1 employment options, Career Services Center offerings this semester, and other timely events and information. Employment Options for International Students

If you're interested in pursuing an internship or job, consider applying for Curricular Practical Training (CPT). CPT is offcampus employment, internship, or other training that is a required or integral part of a degree program. Students may refer to the



USF catalog or contact their academic department to determine whether CPT is a required or optional component of their degree program. Optional Practical Training **(OPT)** is another option for international students and is an off-campus work benefit of F-1 Visa holders. Students have the option to apply for 12 months of work authorization during or after their studies. Students are required to complete a workshop before submitting an OPT application to ISSS. Please note that all F1 students must first receive approval before beginning employment in the U.S. Learn more about these
