

## **Fromm Institute Scholarship in Gerontology**

### **Deadline for Completed Application is Monday, November 7, 2022**

The Fromm Institute for Lifelong Learning at the University of San Francisco offers a \$5,000 scholarship open to continuing USF students who are declared Gerontology minors. The Fromm Institute Scholarship in Gerontology (FISG) is awarded to the applicant who best exhibits a combination of academic achievement, professional promise, and a demonstrated interest in a career in the field of aging. Funds are provided by the Institute through an annual fundraising event that has this scholarship as its focus. The recipient will receive \$5,000 applied to Fall 2023 tuition.

#### **About the Fromm Institute at the University of San Francisco**

Founded in 1976, the Fromm Institute is an educational program for retired people offering noncredit, college-level courses in a wide range of academic subjects. The Fromm Institute fills the meeting spaces of Fromm Hall during USF's academic year and with an emeritus faculty, presents scores of courses in its three, eight-week sessions - Fall, Winter, and Spring. While the Fromm Institute creates a peer age setting within its classrooms, its students have the opportunity to interact with others at USF and are considered campus affiliates with access to the library, cafeteria, and other public spaces. #### **Mission of the Fromm Institute Scholarship in Gerontology - FISG**

This scholarship grants financial aid to a student engaged in the study of gerontology at USF while fostering a commitment to service and an understanding of campus diversity. As such, the FISG provides the recipient both a \$5,000 award and an opportunity to engage/interact with a unique population of older persons in meaningful ways that are mutually beneficial. The recipient will spend time in Fromm Hall among the Institute students (or via online interactive sessions, depending on health and safety concerns) during the 2023 Fall Semester. Please be aware that the contact opportunity is from Monday through Thursday before Fromm classes from 9 to 10 a.m., or during Fromm's lunch period from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Applicants must be declared Gerontology minors.
- Applicants must have completed, or be currently enrolled in, at least 2 classes that are a part of the Gerontology minor coursework.
- Applicants must have at least one year remaining at USF (graduation no earlier than Dec. '23).

#### **Scholarship Conditions**

The FISG recipient will serve as USF's intergenerational representative to Fromm during the Fall 2023 Semester to engage with Fromm students. The recipient will work with Fromm Staff and the Gerontology Minor Director to determine appropriate activities that draw on the recipient's strengths and interests, and yet promote intergenerational contact. Service work can be as simple as helping set up classes and talking with Fromm students during class breaks. Past service work has included: an assistance booth where Fromm students could get help with cell phone settings; playing the piano at lunch to elicit conversation; tours of favorite on-campus places to show Fromm students welcoming spaces they might not know about; hosting a weekly lunchtime social; writing a bi-weekly column in the Fromm newsletter; helping students master technology to interact and attend virtual classes.

#### **Timeline**

The recipient will visit the Fromm Institute and observe its students in and out of their classes and confer with the Fromm Institute Staff and the Gerontology Minor Coordinator during Spring 2023 semester. Plans for Fall 2023 service work will be finalized at that time with the recipient working 2-3 hours per week during Fromm's 10-week Fall term. A brief report from the FISG recipient on their experiences working with Fromm students is due by Dec. 1, 2023.
