It's important to be aware that, as a non-

Filing Taxes

resident student in the US, you are legally required to file a tax return if you received US income during 2021 (Jan. 1, 2021-Dec. 31, 2021). Even if you didn't work or receive income in the US in 2021, you're still obliged to file a Form-8843 with the IRS. USF has arranged free access to Sprintax Tax **Preparation** for you. Sprintax will guide you through the tax preparation process,



arrange the necessary documents, and check if you're due a tax refund or if you owe taxes. On the **ISSS Tax web page** you will find more information about: How to determine if you are a resident or non-resident for tax purposes




