

Learn more » **Optional Practical Training (OPT)** is another option for international students and is an off-campus work benefit for F-1 Visa holders. Students have the option to apply for 12 months of work authorization during or after their studies. Students are required to complete a workshop before submitting an OPT application to ISSS. Please note that all

F-1 students must first receive approval before beginning employment in the U.S. **Learn**

On-Campus Employment is a great resource for international students who are interested in earning extra money. All F-1 degree-seeking students may work up to 20 hours per week on campus while classes are in session. 
