What is a Title IX Coordinator?

The Title IX Coordinator ensures nondiscrimination and compliance with Title IX, which includes the University's response to sexual misconduct.

USF SEX AND GENDER-RELATED MISCONDUCT RESOLUTION PROCESS

1

You share as much or as little information as you want with a Title IX Coordinator.

2

You have access to a Title IX Coordinator who can arrange academic and safety interim supportive measures (academic assistance, housing relocation, etc.).

3

You can receive an overview of formal complaint options and resolution procedures from a Title IX Coordinator.

IF YOU WANT TO FILE A FORMAL COMPLAINT

You may file a formal complaint with the Title IX Coordinator. You may consider informal resolution options and more formal adjudication proceedings, including an investigation and hearing, to resolve your complaint. The investigation will be conducted by a trained Title IX Investigator.

IF YOU DO NOT WANT TO FILE A FORMAL COMPLAINT

If there is no community safety concern, the process ends. All of the interim supportive measures can remain intact. In the rare instance that there is a community safety concern, the case may move forward in the investigative process without the complainant's participation.
