Senator Pairs:

- The Transfer Student Representative is focused on transfer student outreach; planning an email campaign and a transfer student housing floor. They will be participating in a panel on Oct 24. They are also working on Transfer specific orientations in addition to the recognition of TSA and a successful Transfer Student Week.
- The Asian American Student Representative joined the Senior Class Committee and is planning Lunar New Year events with cultural groups and food trucks. They are also collaborating with UM to plan an event in the spring in addition to following up with meetings.
- The Senior Class representative is chairing their class committee, is organizing a workshop titled “Adulting 101,” and is working on internship initiatives. They are also working on projects related to winter graduation such as panels and collaboration with CASA.
