Senator Pairs:

- The Transfer Student Representative is currently working on approval for the TSA, organizing a welcome meeting for the organization, and is continuing to have discussions with administration regarding credits for transfer students, specific scholarships, and priority registration.
- The Senior class Representative is finalizing their CAPS contacts and will follow up with Erin Echols and Julia Hing in the spring. They are also planning with the Senior class committee in anticipation of fall graduation.
- The International Student Representative is planning their SMP presentation and is continuing follow ups with the Housing Department.
- The Asian American Student Representative is organizing meetings for Asian American identifying student groups to promote conversations and connections. They are also connected with the AAPI Resource Center and University Ministry.

Executive Updates:

- The College of Arts and Sciences Representative is continuing their work with the Dean of CAS and connecting with professors to identify areas for stronger ties between administration and students regarding undergraduate and graduate pathways.
- The Latine Student Representative has been working with USFVotes for post election info, has continued MESA meetings and latine community meetups, and is working to create a concrete plan for the LRC.
- The Title IX Representative is continuing collaborations with the Foghorn to establish guidelines for trigger warnings in the newspaper's stories.

Committee Updates:

- The Internal Affairs Committee has voted on $\frac{3}{4}$ of the recommendations provided by the Advocacy Committee and have finished reviewing committee codes which will be presented to the general senate at the end of the month.

- The Students with Disabilities Representative submitted a report on student testimony regarding class inaccessibility, advocated for including accessibility in teaching effectiveness surveys, and secured a seat in related meetings next semester. They have also submitted a recommendation for a title change to the IA committee.
- The Pre-Health Student Representative is focused on following up with Facilities for UC3 patio completion, working on a menstrual product equity resolution, and has submitted a title change recommendation to IA.
- The Gender and Sexual Diversity Representative has adjusted plans for a social event to next semester, communicated with the ADEI office about trans athlete coach training and has submitted a title change recommendation to IA.
- The Student of Color Representative has concluded discussing their title change recommendation and submitted their proposal to IA.
- The Black Student Representative is continuing conversations regarding the BRC with relevant members of administration.

- The Advocacy Committee has approved their committee codes and will begin discussions about the GIFT Fund applicants.
