Call for CTE Co-Director

The Tracy Seeley Center for Teaching Excellence (CTE) invites applications from full-time faculty members to serve as co-director for a term of up to three years, beginning formally in May 2024, with informal interactions with the current co-directors starting in spring 2024.

CTE is a university-wide center founded in 2011 with the mission to celebrate, support, and help develop excellent teaching across the university, at all career stages of all faculty (both part-time and full-time) who teach at USF.

The center hosts a range of programming throughout the year, including Faculty Learning Communities (FLCs), Peer Coaching, Teaching Cafes, Summer Book Club, an annual teaching retreat, and various other workshops, lectures, and campus events. The co-director of CTE works collaboratively with the other co-director and the CTE Steering Committee to set goals, develop and deliver programming, recruit facilitators and attendees for events, and generate newsletters and web content.

Interested full-time faculty with at least five years of teaching experience at USF should send their latest CV and a short 1-2 page statement of why they are interested in the position to the **Center for Teaching Excellence** by **Nov. 30**.

Call for CRASE Co-Director

The Center for Research, Artistic, and Scholarly Excellence (CRASE) invites applications from full-time faculty members and librarians to serve as co-director for a term of up to three years, beginning formally in May 2024, with informal interactions with the current co-directors starting in spring 2024.

CRASE is a university-wide center that is committed to faculty and librarian development. CRASE's mission is to support, promote, and celebrate research, scholarship, and creative work. The center organizes numerous workshops, seminars, writing retreats, and events during the academic year to enhance the research and creative output of our faculty and librarians.

The co-director of CRASE typically works collaboratively with the board and the other co-director to set goals, develop programming, recruit facilitators and attendees for events, collaborate with on- and off-campus stakeholders, run monthly board meetings, and generate newsletters and web content. In this role, the co-directors work closely with the vice provost of equity, inclusion, and faculty excellence.

Faculty members and librarians who are interested in applying should be actively engaged with research, scholarship, and publishing, and/or active in art practice. Faculty should be tenured and/or promoted to the rank of associate professor. Librarians should be at the associate or librarian rank. Mid-career and senior faculty and librarians are encouraged to apply.

Interested faculty and librarians should send their latest CV and a short statement of why they are interested in the position to **CRASE** by **Nov. 30**.



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
