

## Dear Colleagues,

Over the past few months, I have been examining operational efficiencies and exploring how best to align resources in the provost's office in response to fiscal challenges and strategic priorities. I have decided to return to a more streamlined provost's office staffing structure, which existed prior to COVID. As part of this effort, I will be reorganizing the functions that are currently under the position of vice provost of equity, inclusion, and faculty excellence. Sheila Smith McKoy will step down from her position on Nov. 1. Moving forward, the Office of Antiracism, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (ADEI), the Center for Teaching Excellence (CTE), the Center for Research, Artistic, and Scholarly Excellence (CRASE), the Institutional Research Board (IRB), and the Institute for Non-Violence and Social Justice (INSJ) will report directly to me. I am confident that this change will maintain our foundational commitments to ADEI and social justice, faculty development and success, and resources for scholarship and pedagogy. I will continue to evaluate needs and align resources to best support faculty, librarians, and staff as we collectively work to strengthen the distinctive Jesuit education we offer our students.
