USF Student Elections take place Monday to Friday, April 15-19, 2024. Voting will take place beginning at 10am on April 15th and last until 5pm on April 19th.

WHERE TO VOTE

All voting will take place online.

HOW TO VOTE

Log in to the online ballot, view the questions and choices, and make your selections. Use your myUSF login info:

NOTE: Only positions in which you are eligible to vote for will be populated on your ballot. Voter eligibility is determined by the records of the Registrar's Office.

VOTER ELIGIBILITY

Must be a currently enrolled full-time student and have paid the Student Activity Fee for the semester. Graduate students are eligible for the AGSUSF Election. A valid USF student ID number will be required to vote.

REFERENDA

Referendum to Change Eligibility Requirements for Senate Positions

This referendum proposes the amendment of the eligibility requirements to allow more access based on the unique differences of each school and college, instead of the current universal eligibility. The current eligibility requirements for all students state: "All membership in GSS must have full-time enrollment status (6 credits), maintain a minimum overall grade point average of 3.0, and be in good academic and disciplinary standing with USF during their term of office." The proposed change will state: "All membership in GSS must have full-time enrollment status status as determined by their school/college, be in good academic as determined by their school/college, and good judicial disciplinary standing with USF during their term of office."
