



STEP 1 GET CONNECTED

- How you want to connect (phone, email, in person)
- When, where, and how long you would like to meet















Decoding LinkedIn


- Determine likelihood of person seeing your connection request

Decoding LinkedIn


> Do they have a "Contact Info" section at the top of their profile?

Building lasting connections

- On a Zoom/phone call
 - Acknowledge the reason you reached out
 - Look the part
 - > Follow basic Zoom etiquette
- No Traction? No Problem!
 - > Hack their organization's email system <u>Hunter.io</u>
 - Working with no response



It's a Wrap - Things to Remember

- Thank yous!
- Avoid "one and done" building relationships means on-going communication
- > Beware of scammers via messages on LinkedIn
- > Find an Accountability Partner
